Speech Regulations:

1) Each school may enter only one speaker.

2) The speech must be written by the student presenter on a choice of topics that will be provided

3) The speech shall be 3 to 6 minutes in length

4) The speech may be presented from memory or from a note card.

Notes are limited to both sides of ONE 4" x 6" notecard.

A typed manuscript and/or detailed outline must be handed in to the Judge before giving the speech.

5) Props or visual aide materials may be used to enhance the speech.

6) Each speech will be judged in organization of the message, delivery and time.

Prompts:

1. What type of science experiment/project represents your Student Council? Why? Explain how the different parts of the experiment/project represent the different parts of your council.
2. A science team is made up of different roles/jobs. What are the roles/jobs that make your student council create great activities and events for your school?
3. What are some problems that prevent your council from experimenting with new ideas? How does your council rebuild from an "experiment" gone bad?
4. Creativity is essential when it comes to making new science experiments. In what ways has your student council used creativity to keep your student council events fun and exciting? Please provide an example.
